RESIDENTIAL TIME-OF-USE SERVICE RATE SCHEDULE

COMPANY DESIGNATION: 11

AVAILABLE:

Throughout the Company's service territory.

APPLICABLE:

Service under this rate is available as an alternative to Rate 1 for single-phase electric service at secondary voltage in residences, individual apartments and farms. Incidental use for other purposes will be allowed provided that the Customer's load and/or use is predominantly as specified above; otherwise, the appropriate rate in the schedule of rates shall apply for all uses unless residential use is separately measured.

DURATION OF CONTRACT:

One year and thereafter until cancelled by the Customer.

RATE:

Customer Charge of \$0.602 per day plus
During Peak Hours: All energy at \$0.24769 per kWh.
During Off-Peak Hours: All energy at \$0.10558 per kWh.

ALTERNATIVE REGULATION PLAN:

This rate schedule is subject to the Company's Alternative Regulation Plan Rider ("ARP Rider"), which includes an annual Power Adjustor, an annual Exogenous Change Adjustment and an annual Earnings Sharing Adjustor.

PEAK AND OFF-PEAK HOURS:

Peak Hours shall be a period of eight consecutive hours between the hours of 1:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m., Monday through Friday. All other hours shall be considered Off-Peak Hours.

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ADDITIONAL SERVICE CONDITIONS:

- 1) Bed and Breakfast establishments with a total of five bedrooms or less at the premises shall be considered predominantly residential use and shall therefore be eligible for service under this rate schedule. Bed and Breakfast establishments with a total of six bedrooms or more that also demonstrate that they pay annual Vermont Rooms and Meals Tax of less than \$3,000 shall be considered predominantly residential use and shall therefore be eligible for service under this rate schedule.
- 2) For Customers who were receiving service under the Company's dual-fuel/storage heat program requiring two or more meters and who were converted to this rate on October 1, 2002, the Company may continue to meter the Customer's total service with two or more meters and the consumption at all meters will be added together for Billing purposes and be billed to the Customer as one account.
- 3) Specific Peak Hour periods will be posted on the Company's website. These Peak Hours will not be adjusted without prior notification to customers taking service on this rate schedule.
